

# T-Troupe Workshop with Kathy Landry 2017-2018 Season

T-Troupe is composed of dancers aged 8 to 12 yrs old who are the Junior Company for the San Diego Park & Rec. Civic Dance Arts. They help the San Diego Civic Dance Company represent the City of San Diego at public events, conventions, benefits, and community events, while receiving advanced training. Most T-Troupe members go on to join the San Diego Civic Dance Company, the senior performance group.

To become a member of T-Troupe, dancers must attend and complete an eight week workshop in which they will be tested in tap, jazz, and ballet technique. At the end of the eight week workshop, dancers will audition.
