Adult Ensemble meets every Wed. evening 6:45 -8:45 pm. Regular attendance is required and a commitment to rehearsals and performances as necessary. Adult Ensemble is composed of dancers aged 18 and older. They help the San Diego Civic Dance Company represent the City of San Diego at public events while receiving advanced training. To become a member of the Adult Ensemble, dancers must attend and complete this nine-week workshop in which they will be tested in tap and jazz technique.

Current Adult Ensemble members will be required to attend this workshop and re-audition every year.
